Apthorp House - The Apthorp is a historic condominium apartment building in Manhattan, New York City. The Italian Renaissance Revival building designed by architects Clinton & Russell for William Waldorf Astor, was built between 1906 and 1908; it occupies the full block between Broadway and West End Avenue and between West 78th and West 79th streets. For over a century, The Apthorp has been a celebrated, yet serene enclave in the heart of New York's Upper West Side. Conceived in 1908 as the largest, most ambitious apartment house ever built, each of its apartments were unique designs, created with the kind of craftsmanship that today cannot be purchased for any price. Apthorp House hosts private events, weddings, The Food and Drink Festival in May, and our Summer Opening in July and August 2019. John Y Wang Adams House Masters John G.
